

Entry to this Event: All juniors (U18) most welcome. No grading limit. Results will be sent for Rapidplay grading and results, grades and photos may be used on the Kent Junior Chess Association website, www.kjca.org, on the KJCA facebook page and in the Press. Your details will be held on the KJCA database solely to inform you about junior chess events.

Sections: U9, U11, U14 and U18: all part of 2013-14 Kent Junior Grand Prix (see later). The sections are based on ages as on 31 August 2013. If there are insufficient entries in any section, the Organisers reserve the right to combine sections.

Rates of Play: All sections Swiss events: all competitors play every round. **U9, U11:** 6 rounds 30 minutes each. **U14, U18:** 5 rounds 40 minutes each. Clocks used in all sections. Help will be given to anyone unfamiliar with them. FIDE Rapidplay Rules apply. Default time: 20 minutes. Chief Arbiter's decisions final.

- Prize-giving: By 4.45.

Individual Prizes: In U9 section, all players staying to prize-giving will receive a medal. In other sections, cash prizes will go to top 3 players and a medal to the winner. In a tie, cash prizes will be split. Total cash prizes in each section will be: U11 £30; U14 £45; U18 £70. Prizes will not be awarded before the prize-giving. Kent-based players not collecting their prizes will forfeit them.

Food/Drinks: The KJCA Volunteer Mobile Catering will be at this event. In addition to hot soup, there will be cakes, crisps, confectionery and fizzy/hot drinks, all at reasonable prices.

Behaviour/Supervision: The KJCA is most grateful to Sevenoaks Primary School for the use of its facilities. Please treat the school premises with respect. A high standard of behaviour is expected at all times. Players entering or leaving the playing area while other games are in progress should do so quietly.

The KJCA and its officials accept no responsibility for any damage, theft or accident to the person or property of anyone attending this event. They are unable to act in loco parentis for children. Parents/guardians are responsible for their children throughout the entire duration of this event. Children under the age of 8 must remain under sole parental supervision throughout but this supervision may be shared between adults for children of 8 and over. The full KJCA Protection Policy applies as at www.kjca.org and on display at the venue.

Kent Junior Grand Prix: All juniors can earn Grand Prix (GP) points from any section. The GP prize fund totals up to £800. The full GP rules can be found on the KJCA website. The GP has 4 sections (first prize in brackets): U9 (£40), U11 (£60), U14 (£75) and U18 (£100). To be eligible for a prize at the 2014 GP Final, you must be eligible to play for Kent. Appearance for another team in an inter-County event will result in automatic disqualification.

Kent Schools Grand Prix: Eligibility criteria are the same as in the Kent Junior GP. The prize-winners at the 2014 GP Final will therefore be the primary and secondary school with the highest total scores from its best 3 eligible players at each GP event.

Kent County Team Selection: Kent has a proud history of performing exceptionally well at County Team events. This event, along with our other GPs and training days, will be used to guide our team managers in their search for talented juniors who would be able and willing to represent Kent at its inter-county team tournaments. Many of our team managers will be on site on the day and will be available to answer any questions you may have regarding these events, our Kent teams and the selection process.

Directions/Parking: St Olave's Grammar School is just off the A224 Court Road. There should be plenty of Parking on site. Please park with consideration.

Entry Fees: £14/player. Last minute fee: £5/player payable in lieu on entries notified after 31 January 2014. Email/phone entries permitted. Fees remain due with no refunds after 31 January. KJCA members may deduct £1. £10 fee for changing section on/after 31 January. Players arriving without prior notification after 8.50 may be excluded from Round 1. Donations, including unclaimed refunds, most welcome and will be used to invest in local junior chess. Please make any Cheques payable to KJCA. Post entries to Entries Manager, contact details overleaf. Only entries where we have your email will be acknowledged. Direct enquiries to Entries Manager.
