Results will be sent for Rapidplay grading and results, grades and photos may be used on the Kent Junior Chess Association website, www.kjca.org, and in the Press. Your details will be held on the KJCA database solely to inform you about junior chess events.

Sections: U8, U10, U12, U14 and U18: all part of 2013~14 Kent Junior Grand Prix (see later). U8, U10 and U12 also qualifying sections for London Junior Chess Championships. Ages as on 31 August 2012. If there are insufficient entries in any section, the Organiser reserves the right to combine sections.

Rates of Play: All sections are Swiss events: all competitors play every round. U8, U10, U12: 6 rounds; 30 minutes each. U14, U18: 5 rounds; 40 minutes each. Clocks will be used in all sections. Help will be given to anyone unfamiliar with them. FIDE Rapidplay Rules apply. Default time: 10 minutes. Chief Arbiter's decisions will be final.

Individual Prizes: In U8 section; Every entrant receives a medal if they stay to prize giving. In other sections, cash prizes will go to top 3 players and a medal to the winner. In a tie, cash prizes will be split. Total cash prizes in each section will be: U10 £20; U12 £30; U14 £40; U18 £60. Prizes will not be awarded before the prize-giving. Kent-based players not collecting their prizes will forfeit them.

Team Prize: Scores from top 3 juniors from any school will count towards team trophy. In a tie, winner decided by calculating respective sums of opponents' scores.

Food/Drinks: The KJCA Volunteer Mobile Catering will be at this event. In addition to hot soups, there will be cakes, crisps, confectionery and cold/hot drinks, all at reasonable prices.

Kent Junior Grand Prix: All juniors can earn Grand Prix (GP) points from any section. The GP prize fund totals up to £900. The full GP rules can be found on the KJCA website. The GP has 4 sections (first prize in brackets): U9 (£40), U11 (£60), U14 (£75) and U18 (£100). To be eligible for a prize at the 2014 GP Final, you must be eligible to play for Kent. Appearance for another team in an inter-County event will result in automatic disqualification.

Kent Schools Grand Prix: Eligibility criteria are the same as in the Kent Junior GP. The prize-winners at the 2014 GP Final will, therefore, be the primary and secondary school with the highest total scores from its best 3 eligible players at each GP event.

London Junior Chess Championships (LJCC): Qualifying scores for the LJCC sections are as follows: U8-4; U10 Minor and U12 Minor $-3\frac{1}{2}$; U10 Major and U12 Major $-4\frac{1}{2}$. Qualification is not needed for sections over U12. Stronger players also qualify for their own age group by gaining a qualifying score in a higher age group.

Directions/Parking Rathfern School is located between the south circular A205 and the A212 about a mile from the Catford town centre and the one way system. There is no on site parking, so please park with consideration to local residents on the free on road parking places available. The nearest Railway stations are Catford and Catford Bridge and are about a 10 minute walk from there.
